## **Program of Study**

The online Education Specialist (Ed.S.) degree in Mental Health and Addictions is designed to help individuals who have completed a Master's degree in School Counseling (or other related program by approval) obtain the necessary coursework and requirements for licensure as a Nebraska Licensed Mental Health Practitioner (LMHP). Additionally, the Ed.S. in Mental Health and Addictions will provide a needed pathway for School Counselors to become a licensed Alcohol and Drug Counselor (LADC) in Nebraska. Non-CSC school counseling graduates may be required to take additional prerequisites. Graduates of the Ed.S. will have completed the coursework required in Nebraska to apply for the LMHP and LADC license. Students must pass the Counselor Preparation Comprehensive Examination (CPCE) to graduate. The Department of Health & Human Services/Division of Public Health/ Licensure Unit generally approves CSC counselor education courses for professional counselor continuing education (CE) credit.
